PROJECT OF THE MONTH: MARANATHA MISSIONS

Maranatha youth group will send four short-term missions teams to partner with ongoing ministries in Northeast & West Philadelphia; Buffalo, NY; and Puerto Rico. Each summer the teens together raise \$90,000, which goes to various needs such as: field trips for 250 kids each day for Spruce Hill Camp and 100 kids in Northeast Camp, a new roof we will build for a school in Puerto Rico so that it can remain open (it's the only school in the area that has programs for kids with special needs), gifts to our partners so they can continue the work year-round, and meals and transportation for the team doing urban farming in Buffalo, NY. The missions trips are a large part of our vision at Tenth for discipling teens in their pursuit of Christ. Our theme this summer will highlight various heroes in the Bible (many of them young people), who through faith, demonstrated the power and love of God.

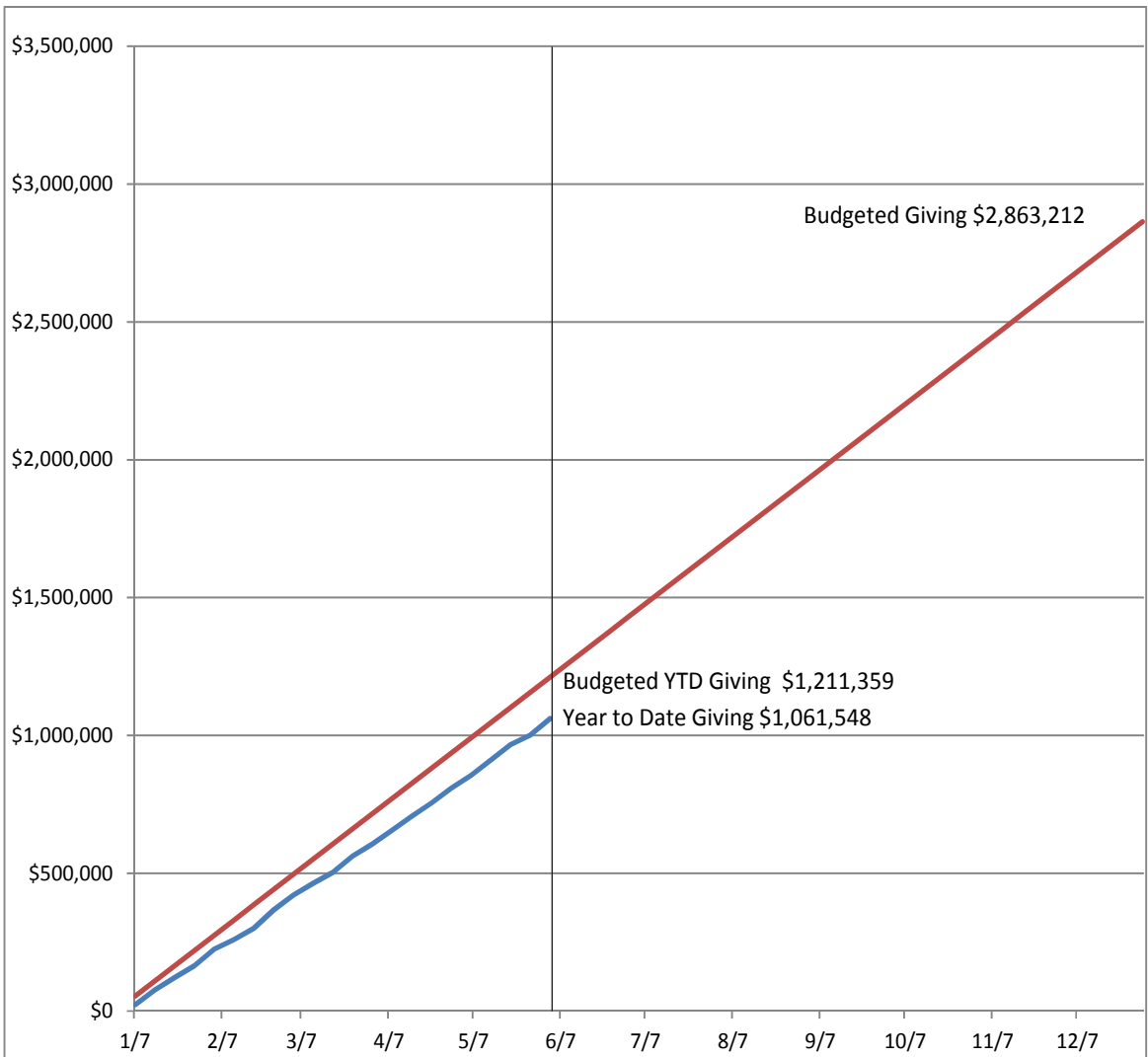

TENTH GIVING 2018



Tenth carries out its gospel-centered mission of proclaiming God’s truth to those of us near and far away through servants who are “worthy of their hire” in their faithful work. Tenth’s funds support those servants and cover other expenses (for our church ministries as well as maintenance, utilities, etc.) that keep the gospel work going.

Combined Church Ministry Fund and Outreach Fund budgets call for a giving total of \$2,863,212. Pray for Tenth’s Elders and Trustees as we all re-commit ourselves to prayer and consider our grateful giving toward ongoing ministry for the gospel in Philadelphia and around the world.

PARKING

Sunday street parking information is at tenth.org/ parking (where you will find all parking details) and on the 2018 parking placard available in the lobbies. Always check at tenth.org for any event parking information, whatever the day of the week.

When using street parking on Spruce and Pine, please remember to use your mirrors and watch for bikers in the bike lane as you pull in and as you open your doors.

Parking in the Liberty Place garage is free Sundays only.

You will need to pick up chaser tickets in Reception Hall immediately after services (near water fountain after morning services, at nursery desk after evening services)—you must show your garage ticket to receive one. Please park at Liberty to free up the streets for neighbors, bikers, and those with mobility issues. The garage has entrances between Market and Chestnut Streets on both 16th and 17th Streets. More details are at tenth.org/parking.

Available Sundays only, if you use the EZ Park lot at 17th and Pine, you must validate your ticket with an EZ Park rubber stamp they have provided in order to get the reduced rate printed on the stamp (note three-hour limit). Stamps clearly marked *EZ Park* are in the Narthex and at the Delancey lobby desk.

The discounted parking rate at the Penn Garage (1700 South Street) for churches is \$6. You must stamp your ticket in the Narthex or at the Delancey lobby desk with Penn parking stamp, but see below for conditions:

Sunday

- All Sunday events are permitted
- Must have exact change after 8 PM

Monday through Friday (must enter after 5)

- Driver must confirm if event is permitted—check on church website
- Must enter after 5 PM
- Must have exact change after 8 PM
